

For the month of October and November, SEE will be focusing on the character trait of **RESPECT**. The students will learn about respecting themselves, one another, and the world around them.

Treating everyone with respect is essential to creating a safe and caring environment at FFCA. Respect begins with basic courtesies that make our days better—please, thank you, and excuse me are the first evidence of a respectful community. Respecting peoples' time is the next. Respectful people show up as promised and ready to begin. And then there is the true test of a respectful community—how you treat the person you disagree with or the stranger who can do nothing for you.

At FFCA, we don't leave important things to chance and that includes our commitment to teaching and modelling exemplary character in our daily lives. It should come as no surprise to anyone that we have a very special document called "Being Heard".

The Being Heard document sets out the communication process for anyone who does not feel satisfied with the way a conversation is going or a concern is being addressed. Stated as simply as possible, you always bring your concern to the person directly first. You assume the other person is interested in hearing your perspective and acknowledging your concern. We have included a copy of the **Being Heard** document in this newsletter for your future reference.

At SEE, we strive to act respectfully everyday in the little things like please and thank you and the big things—hard professional conversations and a culture of ongoing and wide-reaching collaboration.

Knowing you will be treated with respect helps build trust and trust allows people to take risks and taking risks is necessary to learning. We don't call **RESPECT** a core virtue for nothing!

October 7-31


All student materials need to be returned between October 7-18.



Yellow light website: May have some pictures, but not a fun place to play. You need permission from your parents to be on this site. It might ask you for your name.

Green light website: It a safe place to play. Your mom and dad let you go to this website and it has lots of fun activities.

AP-B-401.1 Being Heard Administrative Procedures REVISED August 20, 2019

BACKGROUND & RATIONALE

This document, "Being Heard", is meant to describe the ways in which individuals should work together within FFCA. The belief implicit here is that it is desirable to deal with issues at the level at which they are occurring.

PROCEDURES

1. When making suggestions or raising concerns:

- 1.1. Focus on achieving a positive outcome. (We are all in this together!) Remember that resolving issues does not imply "getting your own way".
- 1.2. Assume that everyone is acting out of good will and doing their best.
- 1.3. If you are not satisfied with someone's actions, speak directly to the person. If you are unsatisfied with the person's response, you should address your concerns to the person's supervisor.
- Be specific; describe the problem and identify the underlying concern.
- Be practical; make suggestions; actively seek resolution.

2. Whom to talk with:

- 2.1. If you have a question or concern regarding the actions/decisions of a campus staff member, discuss the matter with the staff member directly. In the event that the matter is not satisfactorily resolved, discuss it with that campus' Principal Educator.
- 2.2. If you have a question or concern regarding the actions/decisions of a Principal Educator, discuss the matter with that Principal Educator directly. In the event that the matter is not satisfactorily resolved, discuss it with the Superintendent / CEO or designate.
- 2.3. If you have a question or concern regarding the actions/decisions of a Central Office Staff Member, discuss the matter with the staff member directly. In the event that the matter is not satisfactorily resolved, discuss it with the Deputy Superintendent / COO or Secretary Treasurer / CFO.
- 2.4. If you have a question or concern regarding the actions/decisions of a Central Office Coordinator, discuss the matter with that Central Office Coordinator directly. In the event that the matter is not satisfactorily resolved, discuss it with the Superintendent / CEO or designate.
- 2.5. If you have a question or concern regarding the actions/decisions of the Deputy Superintendent / COO, discuss the matter with the Deputy Superintendent / COO directly. In the event that the matter is not satisfactorily resolved, discuss it with the Superintendent / CEO
- 2.6. If you have a question or concern regarding the actions/decisions of the Secretary Treasurer / CFO, discuss the matter with the Secretary Treasurer / CFO directly. In the event that the matter is not satisfactorily resolved, discuss it with the Superintendent / CEO.



- 2.7. If you have a question or concern regarding the actions/decisions of the Superintendent / CEO, discuss the matter with the Superintendent / CEO directly. In the event that the matter is not satisfactorily resolved, discuss it with the Board Chair.
- 2.8. If you have a question or concern regarding the actions/decisions of the Board or Board Chair, discuss the matter with the Board Chair directly. In the event that the matter is not satisfactorily resolved, discuss it with the Superintendent / CEO and Board Chair.
- 2.9. If you have a question or concern regarding Transportation, discuss the matter with the campus Principal Educator. In the event that the matter is not satisfactorily resolved, discuss it with the Director of Transportation, and next with the Secretary Treasurer / CFO if necessary.
- 2.10. If you have a question or concern regarding the actions/decisions of the School Council, discuss the matter with the School Council Chair. In the event that the matter is not satisfactorily resolved, discuss it with the School Council Chair and Principal Educator.

3. Appeals to Board

3.1. In the event that you have followed the procedures above without resolution, please contact the Superintendent to discuss the appropriateness of lodging an Appeal to the Board (Policy 13, Administrative Procedure AP-B-403.1.)

NOTE: If your issue or concern does not fall into any of the categories in the preceding list, or if you are uncertain about whom to contact, please direct your enquiry to the Executive Assistant to the Superintendent, (403-520-3206, ext. 8154).

Last December, our Board welcomed 6 newly-elected Directors. Many of us came to the Board with experience serving on other Boards, and as we get to know each other and learn our roles & responsibilities, we appreciate the grace and warm welcome from the FFCA community. As our calendars fill with upcoming events spanning all 7 FFCA campuses, we are excited to attend as many as possible to get to know parents and staff from each school. In the coming months, we'll be introducing your Board via this newsletter, one Director at a time, in the hopes that you might recognize us and say hello. This month's profile is Rob Zagorsky.



Rob grew up on a farm outside of Tilley, AB. He and his wife Julia are big advocates for Foundations for the Future Charter Academy and the Alberta charter school system. They have two daughters; one who currently attends FFCA SEE and another who will enter kindergarten in 2020.

Rob founded Canadian cybersecurity firm iON United Inc. in 2003. With a very limited budget in the formative years, Rob recognized the need to create a network of cybersecurity customers, industry experts, advisory groups and associations including the Calgary Police Service. Over time, this approach built a strong community and set iON on a path of sustainable growth as evidenced by their achievement as one of Canada's fastest growing companies for the past 4 years.

Over the years, Rob has actively participated in numerous community initiatives including the Calgary Police Cyber Crimes Community Prevention Program,

Calgary Police Rodeo (supporting Missing Children Society of Canada), Canadian Blood Services, Inn from the Cold, Brown Bagging for Calgary's Kids, Calgary Drop-In Center, Calgary Mustard Seed, and iON's Stampede Chuckwagon Committee.
