- Go to www.ffca-calgary.com; click "PowerSchool Parent Portal" in the Online Access section.
- If you haven't already activated your account, check out the instructions (FFCA PowerSchool Parent Portal Access Instructions) on the webpage before proceeding.
- Click the "FFCA PowerSchool Parent Portal" link and log in.
- Click "School Fees and Forms" on the left side menu.
- Select a student attending SEE:
 - select Miscellaneous near the bottom of the page
 - select SEE Spring Concert Tickets
 - select the qty of tickets you require (you do not need to purchase a ticket for any students performing)
- When you're ready to pay, click on the cart at the top right.
- Complete the payment using your Visa/Visa Debit/MC, then click "Return" at the top right.
- 8. You will need to show proof of purchase. To obtain a receipt click the Menu icon at the top right and select "receipts"
- Click Logout from the Menu when you are finished.

- Click on Statements/select the child that you bought the tickets under
- 4. The statement will be downloaded to your device
- 5. Open the downloaded document on your device
- Screen shot or print the downloaded document and if possible, highlight the tickets (to expedite the checking in at the church)

K-3 students are to wear full gala uniform and black shoes will be sent home with your child to wear in the evening. Please return them with your child the next day.

Grade 4 students may dress in their "best dressed" outfit. Please do not feel the need to go out and purchase something. If your child does not own anything dressy, they can wear whatever they feel comfortable in.


Repeat the above 3 steps if you would like to purchase a second book for the same child

You can now enter the hours that you have volunteered during the 2023/2024 school year. Thank you for your patience while we have been setting up the new system.

Login to the PowerSchool Parent Portal in a browser (Rycor cannot be accessed through the App, it must be a browser)

Click on the School Fees and Forms link in the menu on the left


- Click on one of the students at the top who attends the campus you volunteered for
- 4. Click on Parent Partnership at the bottom
- Click on the Volunteer Hour Tracking Form 2023/2024
- Select the campus from the dropdown box where you volunteered
 - Please start a different form for each campus you volunteer at for tracking and reporting purposes
- The name of the parent logged in will be auto-filled under Volunteer; however, you can type in a different name if you are entering the hours for another family member
- You can enter up to 20 dates / volunteer activities on the form

This form will remain editable for the rest of the year. You can go back to the form in the future and enter more dates until all slots are full. If you fill up the form, you can start a new

form for an additional 20 slots.

- To edit the form, click on the same student at the top
- Click on the Completed Forms section under the student names
- Click on the pencil under Edit beside the previously filled-in Volunteer Hour Tracking form







Just a Reminder...

Moving? *** INTERNAL TRANSFER PROCESS***

If your family is moving to a home that is outside the boundary of your child's current campus, your child may remain at that campus, but you will be responsible for transporting your child to and from school. Busing is not available outside the designated campus boundaries. If you require transportation, you will need to apply for an internal transfer to the campus designated for your new address. You may apply on or after the first day of school in the 2023/24 year and applications should be in place by March 1, 2024, to have the best opportunity to transfer for the 2024/25 year. The transfer requests are done through the Online Waitlist system. Internal transfer Requests will precede waitlist students (including priority status and siblings, but not including deferred priority). If the requested campus is unable to accommodate your student, there will still be a guaranteed seat at the current campus. Please see the following link for instructions to request a transfer through the Online Waitlist system.

Please note:

- transfers do not occur mid-year
- transfers can only occur if a seat becomes available in the requested campus (possible wait of up to 6 years)
- we may not be able to accommodate all children in the same family
